# OLD VS. NEW

# OPTION 1: AUTOMATIC

## Holiday Dinner



Antipasti is the first course of a formal Italian meal. In Italian, 'antipasti' means "before the meal." Antipasti typically includes meats, olives, hot peppers, mushrooms, anchovies, artichoke hearts, cheeses, and vegetables in oil or vinegar. Different parts of Italy serve different types of meats and cheeses since certain foods are more common in certain parts of the country.

# OPTION 2: MANUAL

People often eat panettone with a sweet, hot drink such as hot cocoa. Many people enjoy panettone as a late-night snack after returning from the Christmas church service.

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# HOW IT WORKS

\*Each slideshow contains 20-30 slides that contain text and photographs to educate students about winter holidays in other countries.

\*When running automatically, each slide has about 3 seconds of transition time once the slide is finished; once the 3 seconds has passed, the presentation will continue to the next slide.

\*When running manually, there is a speaker button each slide that you press in order to hear the words read aloud. The text also appears on each slide, so you have the option of simply reading the text aloud to your students.

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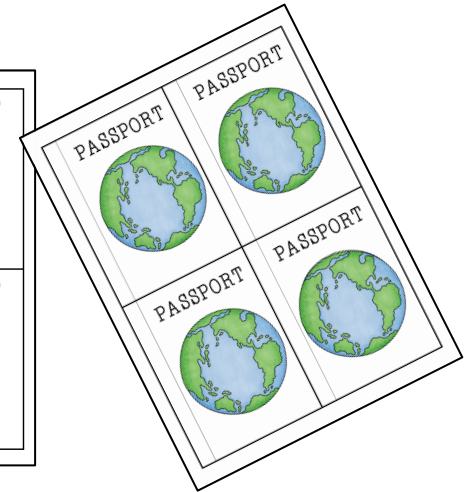
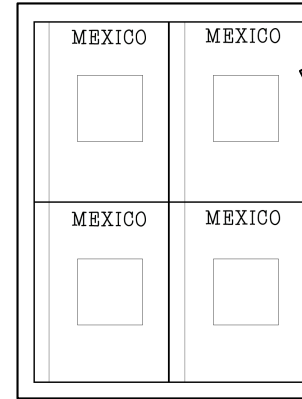
## Comprehension Check

# HOW TO EDIT

Text and photographs in this product are NOT editable; however, you are able to edit the timing of the slides if you wish (for example, making the time between each slide shorter or longer). To do this, simply navigate to the Transitions tab in PowerPoint and type in the number of seconds you'd like to be between the slides in the box marked "After:"
